
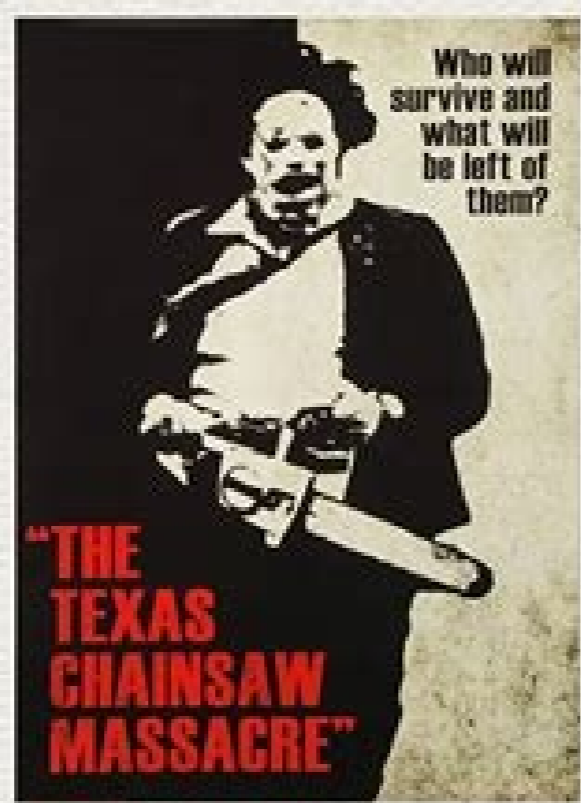
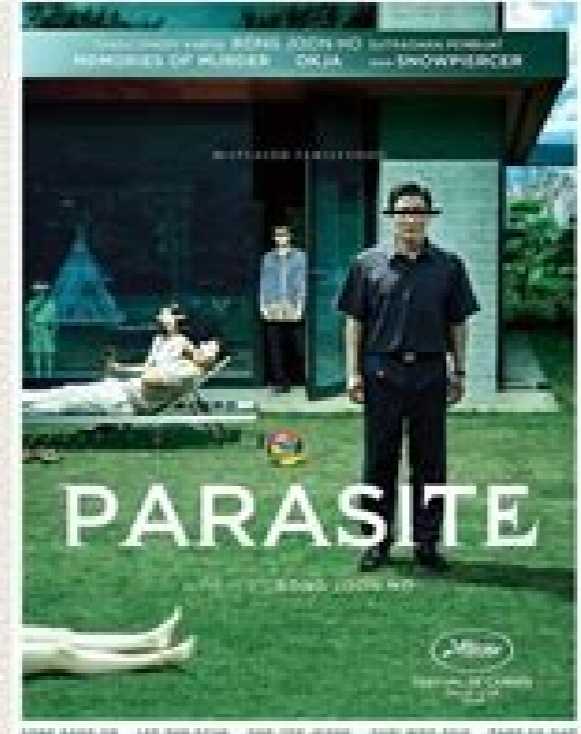

What is genre? What makes a comedy a comedy, a horror film a horror film? Where is comedy, or horror, or action? Is it in the film itself? In viewers' reactions? In how the film industry conceives of and markets the pictures it produces?

All these questions and more will be addressed in this class through a combination of reading, writing, and, most importantly, viewing. Films will span different "genres" (even as we look critically at exactly what that term means) and include titles like Classical Hollywood musical *The Band Wagon*; Indonesian martial arts sensation *The Raid*; and this year's historic Oscar winner *Parasite*.

What types of Film Genre are there?
